

Cardinal Characteristics & Partition Properties

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Abstract

I am going to give an account on connections between the Cardinal Characteristics of the Continuum on the one side and Partition Relations on the other. The \mathfrak{p} -principle, introduced in [978B] allows for a generalisation to a Cardinal Characteristic as done in [997F]. The term \mathfrak{p} then denotes the minimal size of a family of infinite sets of countable ordinals such that every uncountable set of countable ordinals contains a member of the family. The term \mathfrak{b} denotes the unbounding number and \mathfrak{d} the dominating number. The linear refinement number \mathfrak{lt} is the minimal cardinality of a centered family in $[\omega]^\omega$ that has no linear refinement, c.f.[016M] and it is shown in Theorem 2.2 *ibid.* that $\mathfrak{lt} = \aleph_1$ implies $\mathfrak{d} = \aleph_1$. We are able to prove the following:

$$\min(\mathfrak{b}, \mathfrak{p}) = \aleph_1 \implies \omega_1 \not\rightarrow (\omega_1, \omega + 2)^2, \quad (1)$$

$$\mathfrak{b} = \mathfrak{d} \implies \left(\begin{array}{c} \mathfrak{d} \\ \omega \end{array} \right) \not\rightarrow \left[\begin{array}{c} \mathfrak{b} \\ \omega \end{array} \right]_{\aleph_0}^{1,1}, \quad (2)$$

$$\mathfrak{lt} = \aleph_1 \implies \left(\begin{array}{c} \omega_1 \\ \omega_1 \end{array} \right) \not\rightarrow \left[\begin{array}{c} \omega_1 \\ \omega \vee \omega_1 \end{array} \right]_{\aleph_0}^{1,1}, \quad (3)$$

$$\max(\mathfrak{b}, \min(\mathfrak{p}, \mathfrak{d})) = \aleph_1 \implies \omega_1 \omega \not\rightarrow (\omega_1 \omega, 3)^2. \quad (4)$$
